



Antwaan Randle El

Antwaan was a wide receiver and punt/kick returner for the Pittsburgh Steelers and Washington Redskins. He was actually a quarterback in college at Indiana University where he was considered one of the premier offensive threats in the Big Ten Conference. Randle El was the first player in Division I history to pass for 40 career touchdowns and score 40 career touchdowns. He was the Big Ten Player of the Year in 2001 and was named the first-team All-American quarterback by the Football Writers Association of America.



The Steelers selected Antwaan in the 2nd round of the 2002 draft and moved him to the wide receiver position. His ability to throw the football added a new weapon to the Steelers' arsenal as he was called on to pass in trick plays. Most notably, he threw a touchdown to Hines Ward in Super Bowl XL against the Seahawks.

Randle El signed with the Redskins in 2006 and after 4 seasons in the nation's capital, he returned to Pittsburgh for one final season in 2010.

As a devoted Christian man, he says that fame & money are fleeting but God and Christ do not change. "If you put your trust in Him, you can't go wrong." Antwaan backs up his words by running a foundation that provides free clothing and meals to those who are less fortunate.
