



Bill Sampen

Bill began his big league career with the Montreal Expos in 1990 and went 12-7 with a 2.99 Earned Run Average. His rookie year ended up being the best season of his career. He was the first Montreal rookie since Carl Morton in 1970 to lead the club in victories.

In 1991, Bill went 9-5 but his ERA grew. Bill was suffering from arm troubles and had two surgeries within his first three years in the majors.

By mid 1992, Bill was traded to the Kansas City Royals where he played until he signed with the California Angels and played there for his last season in 1994.

In his five seasons of MLB, Bill was better than .500 with a 25-21 won-loss record with a 3.73 Earned Run Average.

In his post playing career, Bill pastored a church and served on the Board of Directors for the Baseball Chapel Program which ministers to baseball players.
