



Brian Glennie

Brian joined the Toronto Maple Leafs in 1969 and had the thrill of having legendary Tim Horton as his first defense partner. Brian quickly established himself as a devastating bodychecker and master of the lost art of the hip check who cleared the crease and played a solid D.

In 1972, Dallas Smith declined to join Team Canada for the Summit series against the Soviet Union. Glennie eagerly took his place and, although he played in only two exhibition games, counts the experience as the greatest outing of his life.

Glennie remained with the Leafs until 1978 before joining the Los Angeles Kings for his final 18 NHL games. Not an offensive powerhouse by any stretch, Brian tallied 14 career goals and 100 assists in his 10 NHL seasons – 9 with the Maple Leafs and the final season with the Los Angeles Kings.
