



Errol Thompson

Errol was adored by Toronto Maple Leafs fans as a member of a line with Hall of Famers Darryl Sittler and Lanny McDonald. He was a speedy left winger with a blazing shot that produced 208 goals in 599 career games. His best single season was the 1975-76 campaign when he scored 43 goals and produced 80 points in 75 games. Of course, he was on the ice when Sittler produced his 6-goal and 10-point night in 1976.



Errol was a likable, easy-going PEI native whose skill allowed him to produce 6 seasons of 20+ goals. He broke his arm in 1976-77 but still managed 21 goals while playing just half the season. The following year, he was sent to the Detroit Red Wings in exchange for tough Dan Maloney. Errol produced for Detroit, just as he did for Toronto, for the next 3 seasons before spending his last half year in Pittsburgh with the Penguins.

While Errol didn't win any league awards, he will always have a warm spot in the hearts of Leaf fans for the thrills he gave them.
