

Glen Wesley

Glen is a 20-season veteran of the NHL. As a junior with the Portland Winter

Hawks, he collected 224 points in 202 games over 3 seasons. He was drafted in the 1st round (#3 overall) by the Boston Bruins and was named to the All-Rookie team. He played 7 seasons for the Bruins before being traded to the Hartford Whalers. Glen remained with this franchise, which later became the Carolina Hurricanes, for most of the next 13 seasons; he played 7 games for the Toronto Maple Leafs in 2003 to interrupt the consecutive games streak.



Glen retired at the conclusion of the 2008 season with 128 career goals, and 409 assists for

Championships. In 2009, the Hurricane's retired Glen's #2 jersey as an honour to

his contributions to the team and the community. At the time of his retirement in 2008, he ranked 6th in career games played by a defenseman.

Glen remains in hockey with the Hurricanes after his retirement and is the team's Director of Defensemen Development, working with the team's defensemen at all levels of the organization and in junior/college hockey.
