



Ricky Horton

Ricky pitched in the majors for 7 seasons, winning 32 games and losing 27 over that time. In his rookie season of 1984, he had a 9-4 record with a 3.44 ERA and one save, a very respectable start for any first year player.

Ricky played four year for the St. Louis Cardinals, had a winning record every year and an ERA under 4.00 each season. He was traded to the Chicago White Sox for the 1988 season and for the Sox he had his first losing record and his

ERA soared. This led to a trade deadline trade to the Los Angeles Dodgers. In 1988, he won the World Series with the

Dodgers. After being released by the Dodgers part way into the 1989 season, Ricky re-signed with the Cardinals but his ERA and winning record never returned to their old form. He retired at the end of the 1990 season.

In his post-playing career, Ricky stayed involved in baseball by becoming a leader of the Cardinals baseball chapel program. He is also a director for the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.
