



Tom Fergus

Tom Fergus was a large 6'3" centreman who was excellent on face-offs. He had a great wrist shot but just couldn't quite put it all together. Having said that, Tom still scored 30 goals in a season twice and had six seasons in excess of 20 goals, so it's not like he couldn't play the game.

Fergus started his career in Boston where he played for 4 seasons scoring 98 goals during that time. Tom was traded to the Toronto Maple Leafs in 1985 and scored 31 goals with 73 points in his first season there. The next two seasons, injuries and illness stripped him of playing time and energy and Toronto put him on waivers only to have the Vancouver Canucks claim him. After two seasons in Vancouver, Tom left the NHL for Europe to play for a couple of final seasons.

In total, Tom posted 581 points including 235 goals in 726 career games – a career that many would like to have.
