

Randy Cross

Randy Cross was a three-time Super Bowl champion with the San Francisco 49ers. A 2nd round draft choice of the 49ers out of UCLA, Cross starred for the team from 1976 to 1988. He started his NFL career by playing the first 2.5 years at center, the next 9 seasons as a right guard, and then the final 1.5 seasons back at center.

In addition to winning Super Bowls XVI, XIX, and XXIII, he was named to the Pro Bowl three seasons in 1981, 1982 and 1984. All Pro selections in this era were made by several different agencies and Randy was named First Team All-Pro by various agencies in 1981, 1984 and 1985. Cross was picked for the NFL's 1976 All Rookie Team.

His college career at UCLA was also one filled with accolades. He was an All-American selection and in his senior year, led his team to the 1976 Rose Bowl championship. Cross was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2010.

After Randy hung up his cleats, he began a long and successful broadcasting career. At various times through the 1990's and to date, he has been a football analyst for CBS, NBC and The NFL Today. He has been a color analyst for US Naval academy home games, hosted shows on Sirius NFL Radio and was a co-host on a radio station program in Atlanta.
