

Tim Raines

Tim Raines is a finally a deserved Hall of Famer. The statistics which Rock posted over his 23 major league seasons brought him immortalization in Cooperstown in 2017.

Tim played for 6 teams in his illustrious career, 13 of them where he was worshipped in Montreal with the Expos. He also spent time with the White Sox, Yankees, A's, Orioles and Marlins. During his career, Rock was regarded as one of the best lead-off hitters and baserunners in the history of the sport.

Rock was the NL Batting Champ in1986, a 7-time All Star and 4-time stolen base champ. His 808 career stolen bases ranks him 5th all-time and his 40 consecutive successful steals was a record for many years. Remarkably, Tim stole 70+ bases in each of his first 6 full seasons in the major leagues.

Raines was a World Series champ with the Yankees in 1986 and 1987, and in 2001 was privileged to play in the outfield for the Orioles alongside his son, Tim Raines Jr. This was only the second time in MLB history that a father and son played in the same game. And for trivia buffs, Tim is one of only a handful of players to play in 4 different decades – the 70's, 80's, 90's and 00's – as his career spanned from 1979 to 2002.

Raines is a member of the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame and the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown.
