



Syl Apps Jr.

Syl Apps became the first son of an NHL player who appeared in an All-Star game to appear in the game himself. Of course, Syl Jr. is the son of legendary Hall of Fame Player Syl Sr.

In 1970-71 the New York Rangers signed Syl and he played half a season for them. The Rangers traded Syl to Pittsburgh where Syl developed into a solid player for many seasons. For four seasons he was on the Century Line with Jean Pronovost and Lowell McDonald and the three were among the league's top scorers.

In the 75-76 season, Syl had a career year with 32 goals and 99 points.

Apps finished his career in Los Angeles with the Kings and was subsequently inducted into the Penguins hall of fame. Syl's son, Syl III, had a tryout with the Leafs in 1999 and his daughter Gillian won gold with the Canadian Olympic team.
