



Otis Wilson

Otis Wilson was the #1 draft choice for the Chicago Bears in 1980 after graduating from the University of Louisville. As the left linebacker next to Mike Singletary in the middle, Otis was the primary blitzer in the Bears hallowed defense. In fact, in the Bears' amazing 1985 season, he sacked the quarterback 10.5 times and followed that up in 1986 with 8 sacks.

The 1985 Bears team won Super Bowl XX and is touted to be the most dominant defensive team in NFL history. Wilson was part of the top-ranked and most feared defensive team, which held 11 of 16 opponents to 10 points or less.

Wilson's career with the Bears spanned from 1980-1988. During that time he appeared in the Pro-Bowl twice, once in the '83-'84 season, and again in the season '85-'86. After a successful career with the Bears for 8 years, Otis left and played with the L.A. Raiders in 1989.

He stayed with L.A. for only 1 year and retired after the 1989 season. After his career he was named to the All-Madden Century Team.



Today, Wilson uses his notoriety to help children in disadvantaged neighborhoods, providing health and fitness programs for at-risk youths.
