

Bobby Hull

"The Golden Jet" was one of the most electrifying players in the history of the NHL. Bobby would lift fans out of their seats with his rushes down the left wing and the hardest shot in the league. And Bobby produced results:

- Stanley Cup winner 1961
- Art Ross Trophy (leading scorer) 3 times 1960, 1962, 1966
- Hart Trophy (most valuable player) 2 times 1965, 1966
- Lady Byng Trophy (most gentlemanly player) 1 time 1965
- NHL First Team All Star 10 times 1960, 1962, 1964 1970, 1972
- NHL Second Team All Star 2 times 1963, 1971
- Lester Patrick Trophy (contribution to hockey in the US) 1 time 1969
- Gary Davidson Trophy (WHA MVP) twice 1973, 1975
- WHA First Team All Star 3 times 1973 1975
- WHA Second team All star 2 times 1976, 1978
- Played in 12 NHL all-star games
- 610 goals, 560 assists and 1,170 points in 1,063 NHL games in 16 seasons
- 303 goals, 335 assists and 638 points in 411 WHA games in 6 seasons

Now that's a lot of awards. But they don't even begin to describe Bobby Hull. Those who saw him play will always remember the blinding speed, the hellacious slapshot, the hair flowing in the breeze and the tremendous physical strength.

Of course, Bobby didn't have all the hockey talent in the Hull family. Brother Dennis scored over 300 NHL goals and of course son Brett bettered his father's goal mark, in a different era of hockey of course, with 741 goals.

Bobby was voted the 8th best NHL player of all-time by The Hockey News.
