

Lloyd Moseby

Nicknamed "The Shaker" for his moves on the basketball court, Lloyd was drafted

by the Toronto Blue Jays with their number one pick, number two overall in the nation in 1978. He was called up to the big leagues after just two seasons in the minor leagues. He made the All-Star team in 1985, and was considered with George Bell, and Jesse Barfield the best outfield in baseball in the mid to late 1980's. His best year was in 1983, he led the league with 15 triples, and won the Silver Slugger award.

Lloyd then played in Detroit for two years, for Sparky Anderson. Following that, he ventured off to Japan to play in Tokyo. Overall, Shaker played 12 years in the majors, and two years in Japan.

Lloyd is the Blue Jays all time leader in stolen bases with 255. In 1997, Lloyd was a coach for the St. Catherine's Stompers, a AA team for Toronto Blue Jays and in 1998 moved





up to coach Toronto's triple "A" club in Syracuse, New York. In 1999, Lloyd was the first base coach for the Toronto Blue Jays.

Moseby was one of many strong Christian on the popular Blue Jays clubs on the 1980's.
