


## **Dennis Hull**

Dennis is the most popular after-dinner sports speaker in Canada. His brand of humour has folks doubled over with laughter whether or not they are hockey fans. Dennis lampoons his own career which was spent in the shadow of his more famous brother Bobby. However, Bobby and his Hall of Fame career, along with many other

Blackhawk alumni, are the targets of many of Dennis' hysterical stories.

Dennis became an author with the publication of his book titled "Third Best Hull: I Would Have Been 4th But They Wouldn't Let My Sister Maxine Play".
